- 2. EXPLORE YOUR OPTIONS. The world is full of exciting careers! Don't limit yourself to what you already know. Explore different fields by talking to people in various professions, reading books, watching documentaries, or even trying out hobbies related to different jobs. You might discover something you never knew existed!
- 3. CONSIDER YOUR LIFESTYLE. Think about the kind of lifestyle you want in the future. Do you prefer a structured 9-to-5 job, or do you thrive in a more flexible environment? Are you willing to travel or relocate for work? Do you want to work outside or in an office based job? Considering these factors can help you narrow down your options.

- 4. SET GOALS. Once you have an idea of what you're interested in, set some goals to work towards. Whether it's getting good grades, gaining relevant experience through internships or volunteering, or pursuing further education, having goals will keep you motivated and focused.
- 5. SEEK GUIDANCE. Don't be afraid to ask for help! Talk to your teachers, Mrs Wood the school careers advisor, family members, friends or mentors about your career aspirations. They can offer valuable advice, insights, and support to help you make informed decisions.
- 6. BE OPEN TO CHANGE. Remember that it's okay if your interests and goals evolve over time. Your career path doesn't have to be set in stone. Stay curious and open-minded, and be willing to adapt as you learn more about yourself and the world around you.
- 7. FOLLOW YOUR PASSION. Last but not least, follow your passion! Choose a career that excites and inspires you, something you genuinely enjoy doing. When you love what you do, work doesn't feel like work—it feels like fulfilling your purpose.
